IMPORTANT SCHOOL PAYMENT AND ATHLETIC TICKETING INFORMATION

SCHOOL CREDIT/DEBIT CARD PAYMENTS

Freeman School District implemented an upgraded digital payment service that went into effect on August 2nd, 2023. Please note that when paying by credit/debit card a processing fee will be applied to the total. Cash and checks will still be accepted without a fee. With the rising costs of processing fees, the annual amount the district has been paying to cover these fees is becoming significant and we do not believe is the best use of our public dollars.

- When paying <u>online</u>, each transaction will incur a 3% processing fee. (student fees, meal account payments, etc.)
- When paying <u>in person</u> by card, each transaction will incur a flat \$0.50 processing fee. *This includes Dawg House purchases*
- Please note that because of increased security with credit card processing, our new system no longer allows us to manually enter credit card numbers and take payments over the phone.

ATHLETIC EVENT TICKETING AT FREEMAN HIGH SCHOOL

- We will be using GoFan for digital ticketing for athletic events at Freeman High School. Fans can purchase tickets online through the Freeman High School GoFan page or by presenting a card or mobile payment option at the ticket gate (also through GoFan). All major credit cards are accepted, along with Apple Pay and Google Pay. The associated fees with GoFan tickets will be \$1 + 3% per ticket.
- You will still be able to use cash or check at the gate in person with no fee, but GoFan will be the only option for athletic event card payments moving forward.
- All season passes and playoff games/tournaments will only be available to purchase through GoFan. Please visit https://gofan.co/app/school/WA23764 to purchase tickets and passes.

The new ticketing policy is something that our league is moving towards as a whole for consistency and to operate a more efficient and professional ticket gate while elevating the fan experience. Buying tickets online allows fans to access and share tickets easily by email or text and will cut down on ticket line time significantly when purchased ahead.

We encourage you to buy tickets online prior to reaching the facility. For your convenience, signage will be set up at the venue to help fans navigate an online purchase quickly and easily.

Chromebook CAP

Optional Chromebook Assurance Program | Grades 6-12 | 2023-2024 School Year

As part of our learning program, the Freeman School District provides a Chromebook to all secondary students (Grades 6-12). This device is the property of the Freeman School District. Chromebooks are issued to 6th-12th grade students in September and collected in June.

Families have the opportunity to enroll in the district's optional Chromebook Assurance Program (CAP). While not mandatory, this insurance program is highly recommended as it provides coverage in the event the device is lost or damaged. Annual cost is \$20 per student for the school year. Families who choose to enroll more than two Middle or High School students in CAP will only be required to pay for two CAP enrollments to cover all district-owned devices in the family each school year. Defective devices will be replaced or repaired at no cost to the family. Fees must be paid prior to September 30, 2023.

- To <u>opt-in</u> to the annual insurance program, there is a \$20 fee for the school year. Fees must be paid prior to September 30, 2023. To purchase insurance, access Online Payments at https://wa-freeman.intouchreceipting.com
- Opting out of the program means families will be held financially responsible for the full cost of repair or replacement associated with any damaged, lost or stolen equipment. A fine will be placed on student accounts for the cost of replacing or repairing the equipment.
- · Lack of action prior to September 30th will be considered an opt-out.

OPT-IN - Chromebook Insurance Program

Annual Fee: \$20 nonrefundable

Annual Coverage:

- Accidental Damage: First incident covered in full. After first incident, family
 is responsible for full replacement of damaged part, or up to \$200 total per
 incident. (Loaner device available during repair.)
- Lost or Stolen: First incident \$100. \$200 for subsequent incidents. (If stolen, Police Report must be filed within 24 hours and a copy provided to the school Business Office.) If the device is later found or recovered and is in working condition the fee will be refunded.

Not Covered:

- Intentional damage, neglect or loss without a copy of a Police Report.
- · Lost/Damaged Power Cord (\$30)

Note: Replacement equipment will not be issued until fees set forth above have been paid or there is a payment plan in place.

We are thrilled to inform you that new legislation, SSSB 5048, has been passed in Washington State, eliminating the fees for all College in the High School (CiHS) courses. These CiHS courses offer an exceptional opportunity for our students to earn college credit while still in high school. We believe this initiative aligns perfectly with our commitment to providing an enriching and academically rigorous experience for every student at Freeman High School.

While our CiHS course offerings are currently available to our upperclassmen, we feel it's important to extend this information to our 9th and 10th-grade families as well. Including you in this communication is part of our efforts to aid in the planning process for your students' academic goals. This early awareness will empower your students to consider these courses as they shape their educational pathways.

Freeman High School is offering an array of CiHS courses that cater to a variety of interests and academic pursuits:

- ENGL 101: College Composition-EWU (offered even graduation years)
- POLI 100: Introduction to US Politics-EWU
- MATH 141: Pre-Calculus 1-EWU
- MATH 142: Pre-Calculus 2-EWU
- BIOL 101: Fundamentals of Biology-CWU
- BIOL 201: Human Physiology-CWU (offered even graduation years)
- ENST 201: Earth as an Ecosystem-CWU
- ENGL 170: Introduction to Literature-EWU (offered odd graduation years)

We're proud to highlight that most of these courses are taught in conjunction with Advanced Placement (AP) courses, providing our students with multiple avenues to earn college credit. This approach empowers our students to challenge themselves academically while reaping the benefits of college-level instruction while remaining in the familiar high school classroom setting.

I encourage you to explore these opportunities with your students and have open discussions about their academic goals. I am available, along with our teachers, to provide guidance and support as your students navigate their choices.

As we embark on this exciting new chapter together, we want to express our gratitude for your ongoing support of Freeman High School's commitment to excellence in education. We believe that these CiHS courses, made far more accessible by the recent legislation, will contribute significantly to your student's academic journey and future success.
