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
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FREE/REDUCED LUNCH APPLICATION PROCESS

Each school year, students who were on the free/reduced eligibility meal program for the previous school year are allowed to carry over their eligibility into the new school year for 30 School Days from the first day of school. For SY 2025/26, that 30-day window ends on October 2, 2025. If we do not have an updated free/reduced price meal application, or other qualifying updated eligibility status for the new school year, any students who qualified for free/reduced price meals during the previous school year will automatically have their eligibility changed to Paid effective Oct 3, 2025. Applications can be completed online through Skyward Family Access. Additionally, applications may be picked up from the school district or sent home with students.



Every year we <u>must</u> have all back to school forms completed for every student. Please log in to Family Access and complete form sets for each student. To date, only 1/2 of our FHS students have completed forms. You can find this on the left side of your home page on the Skyward Family Access screen titled "FHS Registration for All Returning Students". Also important in these forms is opting in or out of Chromebook Assurance Plan by September 15th. Please note: you must also pay for the Chromebook Assurance by 9/15.


2025-26 YEARBOOK NEWS





Class of 2026: Yearbook **Senior Pictures & Tributes**

Deadline -October 15

Senior portraits and kid pictures are due October 15 for the 2026 Yearbook!

Submitting Senior Photos - both kid and senior portraits.

In order to receive the highest quality image, we are requesting that you submit your photos on-line this year (see directions below). Many studios will be able to do this for you. The senior portrait must be 2"x3" (vertical orientation) and at least 300 dpi. Scanned kid pictures should also be 300 dpi and approximately 2"x3". They can be any photo of your student starting from birth to whatever age you prefer/have access to a photo.

Deadline to submit **both** these photos to the yearbook is **Tuesday, October 15.**

Directions to upload your photos:

- A. **RENAME** before uploading your photo so that we avoid misnaming your senior. Pease save the image as a full size save and rename the photo as follows: Student's firstname_lastname (ex. Jenny_Smith) and your kid portrait to firstname_lastname_kid (Jenny_Smith_kid) so that it is easy to identify photos.
- B. Next, go to https://yearbookshare.com/eShare/?code=dawgcountry . School code for Freeman is dawgcountry
- C. You will be asked to put in your name, email and phone number. D. You will then be asked to "Agree to Terms", which is typical.

- E. You will then be asked to browse to your photo. Simply navigate to where you have the photo saved, select the photo, and click on upload.
- F. You are almost done it will then ask for some information about the picture, such as who is in it - please type in your child's name (we default to your student's given name in the yearbook. They may see me if they'd like to use a preferred name instead per state law). That's all there is to it!

Senior Tributes: If you are interested in purchasing a tribute, or "shout-out" for your child or grandchild, please see the reverse side of this flyer for information. You will be able to submit photo(s) and a message for your senior in the yearbook! What a great way to say something special that will last a lifetime! Hurry though space is limited! We sold out last year! To reserve your spot, simply contact Ms. Longinotti with the size you would like, or purchase your tribute through your student's account by October 31 to reserve your spot and send in your info. Content for your tribute is due on Dec. 1. Payment is due by December 15th. Chromebook CAP

Optional Chromebook Assurance Program | Grades 6-12

As part of our learning program, the Freeman School District provides a Chromebook to all secondary students (Grades 6-12). This device is the property of the Freeman School District. Chromebooks are issued to 6th-12th grade students in September and collected in June.

Families have the opportunity to enroll in the district's optional Chromebook Assurance Program (CAP). While not mandatory, this insurance program is highly recommended as it provides coverage in the event the device is lost or damaged. Annual cost is \$20 per student for the school year. Families who choose to enroll more than two Middle or High School students in CAP will only be required to pay for two CAP enrollments to cover all district-owned devices in the family each school year. Defective devices will be replaced or repaired at no cost to the family. Fees must be paid prior to 3 weeks after the first day of school.

- To opt-in to the annual insurance program, there is a \$20 fee for the school year. Fees must be paid prior to 3 weeks after the first day of school. To purchase insurance, access Online Payments at https://wa-freeman.intouchreceipting.com
- Opting out of the program means families will be held financially responsible for the full cost of repair or replacement associated with any damaged, lost or stolen equipment. A fine will be placed on student accounts for the cost of replacing or repairing the equipment.
- · Lack of action prior to September 15th will be considered an opt-out.

OPT-IN - Chromebook Insurance Program

Annual Fee: \$20 nonrefundable

Annual Coverage:

- Accidental Damage: First incident covered in full. After first incident, family
 is responsible for full replacement of damaged part, or up to \$200 total per
 incident. (Loaner device available during repair.)
- Lost or Stolen: First incident \$100. \$200 for subsequent incidents. (If stolen, Police Report must be filed within 24 hours and a copy provided to the school Business Office.) If the device is later found or recovered and is in working condition the fee will be refunded.

Not Covered:

- Intentional damage, neglect or loss without a copy of a Police Report.
- · Lost/Damaged Power Cord (\$30)

Note: Replacement equipment will not be issued until fees set forth above have been paid or there is a payment plan in place.

This method is fast, secure and highly reliable because it is strictly regulated by the wireless carriers and only allows access to approved providers.

If you've ever sent a text vote for a TV show to a number like 46999, you have used short code texting.
