# January 16 is Martin Luther King, Jr. A Time Line of MLK's Life



 Born Michael King, January 15, 1929, Atlanta, Georgia

#### 1940s

- Enters Morehouse College, Atlanta, Georgia
- The Atlanta Constitution publishes
   King's Letter to the Editor stating
   that black people "are entitled to
   the basic rights and opportunities
   of American citizens"
- Ordained to Baptist Ministry as Assistant Pastor (Ebenezer Baptist Church), (19 years old!)
- Attains Bachelor of Arts in Sociology
- Enters Crozer Theological Seminary, Chester, Pennsylvania

#### 1950s

- Graduates from Crozer with Bachelor of Divinity; serves as Valedictorian
- Enters Boston University for graduate studies
- Marries Coretta Scott
- Begins pastorate at Dexter Avenue Baptist Church, Montgomery, Alabama
- Awarded Doctorate in Systematic Theology, Boston University
- First Child Born, Yolanda
- MLK becomes president of newly formed Montgomery Improvement Association (MIA), Holt Street Baptist Church
- Speaks at mass meeting; his home is bombed. Pleads for nonviolence addressing angry crowd
- US Supreme Court affirms Browder v. Gayle declaring Montgomery and Alabama bus segregation laws unconstitutional
- Montgomery City (bus) Lines resume full service; King is among first passengers in desegregated and integrated buses
- Named chairman of the Southern Negro Leaders Conference on Transportation and Nonviolent Integration (later known as Southern Christian Leadership Conference, SCLC)
- Appears on cover of *Time* magazine
- Delivers national address, "Give Us the Ballot" at Prayer Pilgrimage for Freedom
- Meets with President Nixon, June 13, 1957
- Welcomes second child, Martin, III

- Meets with President Eisenhower
- Publishes first book, "Stride Toward Freedom: The Montgomery Story"
- Stabbed during book signing and survives

#### 1960s

- Becomes Assistant Pastor at Ebenezer Baptist Church
- Found not guilty of tax fraud by white jury in Alabama
- Meets with President John F. Kennedy
- Third child born, Dexter
- Arrested with other protestors, Albany, Georgia
- Arrested at prayer vigil and jailed
- Assaulted at SCLC Conference by American Nazi Party member
- Fourth child born, Bernice
- Publishes book of sermons, "Strength to Love"
- March on Washington for Jobs & Freedom, 200,000 demonstrators at Lincoln Memorial. Delivers "I Have a Dream" speech
- Delivers eulogy at funerals of four children killed in bombing of the 16th Street Baptist Church, Birmingham
- US Attorney General authorizes wiretap on King's home phone
- Named Man of the Year by Time magazine
- Meets with President Lyndon B. Johnson
- Publishes book, "Why We Can't Wait"
- Arrested and jailed for demanding service at whiteonly restaurant, Florida
- Accused of lying and association with SCLC as Communists and moral degenerates
- Meets with FBI Director J. Edgar Hoover
- Receives Nobel Peace Prize
- Leads marchers, Selma to Montgomery, after US District Judge upholds right of demonstrators to conduct orderly march
- Publicly opposes Vietnam War
- Moves to apartment in Chicago to draw attention to poor housing conditions
- Connects with Nation of Islam Leader
- Shot and wounded during "March Against Fear"
- Publishes book, "Where Do We Go from Here: Chaos or Community"
- Leads strike of sanitation workers in Memphis which descends into violence (King rushed from scene)
- Delivers final speech at Memphis March, "I've Been to the Mountaintop"
- Assassinated in motel, Memphis (age 39)
- Buried in Atlanta

Third-grade teacher Jennifer Jensen had the childhood nickname of "Jen" (still used today) and "Sis."


