Mrs. Smith's childhood (and current) nickname was Ange. On her bucket list is to travel Europe. Among her favorite activities are cooking, reading and running!

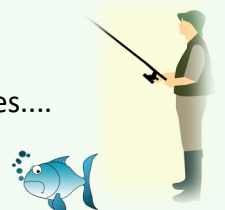
