

Freeman School District Nutrition Services (FSD-NS) will always feed students one full breakfast and one full lunch every day, regardless of free, reduced or paid status, and regardless of funding on a student's account. Even if a student has a negative balance on their meal account, FSD-NS will always serve a full meal if requested by the student.

However, please note that regardless of eligibility (F/R/P), if a student's meal account has a negative balance, FSD-NS will not serve a la carte items* to that student (chips, drinks, Rice Krispy Treats, individual milk or juice, etc.). We will serve these students a full breakfast or lunch if requested. Additionally, if a student wants a second serving of breakfast or lunch, there needs to be funds on the students account to pay for the second meal/entrée. SUMMER EBT BENEFITS (Summer 2025)

Washington State is providing summer EBT benefits to families in need while students are out of school for the summer.

Who is eligible for SUN Bucks?

- 1. Any student enrolled at an NSLP (Lunch Program) or SBP (Breakfast Program) participating school AND
- Living in a household with income that meets NSLP Income Guidelines to qualify for free or reduced-price meals.
- 3. Families who qualify will be notified in June 2025.

If I qualify, how do I access Sun Bucks EBT Benefits?

- If your household qualifies for SUN Bucks this year, and received SUN Bucks last summer and you still have your SUN Bucks EBT card, funds will automatically be loaded onto that card.
- If your household qualifies for SUN Bucks this year, and you received SUN Bucks benefits last summer, but do not have your old EBT card, you can request a new one.
- 3. If you are newly qualified for SUN Bucks this year, an EBT card will be mailed to the student's address of record with Freeman SD.




App for Parents & Families
