


Geese are loyal to their families.

American Red Squirrel

Introducing this quick, little **diurnal** animal, commonly called a *Pine Squirrel*. This small squirrel is easily distinguished from grey squirrels due to its small size (but larger than a chipmunk), red hues and white underbelly. They are known to defend a year-round, exclusive territory. They are primarily **granivores**.

One of their special behaviors is to collect or "harvest" spruce cones, storing them in a cache. The fallen scales that drop from the cones as the squirrel derives nutrients from the rest of the cone create a **midden** which can be up to 12 feet across! And, by the way... spruce trees exhibit masting cycles, and a year of abundant cone production is called a **mast year**, and it is followed by several years in which cone production dwindles. The squirrel's territory may have one

or several middens. (They also consume a variety of mushrooms, even some that are poisonous to humans. Additional diet may include spruce buds and needles, mushrooms, willow leaves, poplar buds and catkins, bearberry, flowers, berries, animal material such as bird eggs or even the young of snowshoe hares!).

Pine squirrels begin breeding at about a year old. They are spontaneous ovulators, generally just one day each year. They can be chased by several males during this important day, and may mate with 4-16 males. Then **gestation** is about 31-35 days—for a typically single, annual litter of one to five young, but usually three or four. (They usually breed once annually, but could skip a year, and occasionally have two litters.) They reach adult body size at 125 days, but emerge from their first nest at about 42 days.

They will nurse approximately 70 days, growing about 1.8 grams per day during this time. One squirrel may have numerous nests in its territory and may move the young among them. They generally nest in cavities, or in grass gathered in tree branches, but rarely below ground.

Interesting facts about them: research shows their interactions socially with other squirrels seem to be entirely and solely for reproduction. Also, they can swim!

Definitions

Diurnal: most activities are done during the day **Granivore**: eats primarily grains and seeds

Gestation: development inside the womb, between conception and birth
