- 1. Participants must compose their own essay.
- 2. The essay must be clearly handwritten, typed or computer prepared.
- Judging will be under the guidance set by the Veterans of Foreign Wars. Judging will include 30 points for addressing the theme, 30 points for clarity of Ideas, 40 points for Theme Development.
- 4. Since this program is completely voluntary, a student does not have to go through his/her school to participate. Any student from any school in the State of Washington may enter the program by contacting a local Post or Auxiliary for rules and Official Entry form. Home Schooled students are also eligible.
- A copy of the Official Entry form must accompany the essay. All sections of the official entry form **MUST** be completed at the Post/Auxiliary level. Entry forms **MUST** be signed by a parent.
- 6. All essays become the property of the Veterans of Foreign Wars, Department of Washington. <u>If copies are desired, you must make your own. Chairman will not return essays.</u>
- 7. Contest begins at the start of the school year.
- 8. Length: Not to exceed 250 words.
- 9. Student's Name, City, or School **MUST NOT** be on the essay, only on the entry form.
- 10. Essay must stay within the prescribed subject matter and there can be **NO** added color or artwork.
- 11. Essay written in poem form will not be accepted.
- 12. The Post or Auxiliary sponsoring the school **MUST** do the judging at the local level.

Essays due to local Post/Auxiliary by: October 31st

Any Essay not **received** by the deadline will not be accepted.

HOW TO ACCESS THE PLATFORM

A whitelist or allowlist is a list or register of entities that are being provided a particular privilege, service, mobility, access or recognition. Entities on the list will be accepted, approved and/or recognized. Institutions that want to work with Scholar's App must whitelist the following domain: *.scholarsapp.com/* - each institution can do so by reaching out to their IT department or IT manager.

We are working on gaining an allowlist status with your State Department of Education, but if you're unable to access the platform, please use your personal device at home or on a public network to apply.

SECURITY POLICY

Scholar's App set of security features:

PRIVACY POLICY

Scholar's App is CPA (Consumer Privacy Act) compliant whereby the consumer has the right to limit use and disclosure of sensitive personal information. CPA provides personal information rights and protections for consumers, defined as natural persons. Scholar's App is compliant on not disclosing personal information to a third party for monetary consideration meaning we do not sell your personal information to third parties. CPA gives consumers the right to know what personal information Scholar's App are collecting and how that information is being used.

Scholar's App have two legal responsibilities toward consumers: they must inform consumers in advance regarding data collection and respond to a consumer's request to know what has been collected.

Inform Consumers
