



Conferences are scheduled in 20-minute intervals, with fiveminute pass times to accommodate parents with multiple conferences.

Freeman Middle School

The Skyward Conference Scheduler will be open for grades K-6. Sixth grade conferences will be scheduled with *homeroom* teachers only. **The fall 7th & 8th grade schedule is organized by teacher invitation for group conferences.** If you have any questions or concerns throughout the school year, we encourage you to contact teachers directly through their email or by calling the Freeman Middle School office at 291-7301.



Farm Talk—Farm Animal Vernacular

foal—(noun) a young horse or related animal; (verb) give birth to a foal filly—a young female horse, especially one less than four years old

colt—a young uncastrated or
"intact" (not 'neutered') male horse, in
particular one less than four years old
stud—a stallion, in particular one used
for breeding

mare—a female horse or other equine animal

stallion—an uncastrated adult male horse

gelding—a castrated animal, especially a male horse

calf—(noun) a young bovine animal, especially a domestic cow or bull in its first year

calves—plural of calf (more than one) **calve**—give birth to a calf

bull—an uncastrated male bovine animal (as in, bull calves)

beast of burden—an animal used to bear weight, as in packing, transport or in farming (draft horses, horse-drawn equipment)

cattle—large ruminant animals with horns and cloven hoofs, domesticated for meat or milk, or as beasts of burden; similar animals of a group related to domestic cattle, including yak, bison and buffalo

herd—a large group of animals, especially hoofed mammals that live, feed or migrate together or are kept together as livestock

cow—a fully grown female animal of a domesticated breed of ox, kept to produce milk or beef

steer—a castrated bull heifer—a young female cow that has not borne a calf

Children's Health Month reminds us that children are uniquely vulnerable to environmental hazards. This is because their systems are still growing and developing. Also, their behaviors may lead to more exposure. How will you celebrate Children's Health Month? Read on for resources and ideas to carry out in October and all year long. Cheers to healthy kids!

Children's Health Month Resources for Schools

Drinking Water in Schools and Child Care Facilities

Find information about drinking water quality in schools and child care facilities.

Site includes guidance, tools, laws and regulations, and information about partners.

Integrated Pest Management (IPM) in Schools

Provides safe and usually less costly options for effective integrated pest management options for schools.

School IPM programs use strategies to reduce sources of food, water and shelter for pests.

SC3 aims to ensure that all schools are free from hazards associated with outdated and unnecessary chemicals.

Tips for Children's Health Month

- Eliminate Asthma Triggers. Manage asthma triggers in the dassroom: mold, dust, pests, fragrances, and so on.
- Reduce Exposure to Air Pollution. Limit students' outside activities when the Air Quality Index rises to unhealthy levels.
- Prevent Poisoning. Store cleaning products, lab chemicals, and pesticides out of reach.
- Keep Your School Pest-Free. Pests need food, water and shelter. To keep pests in check, get rid of clutter, empty garbage often, fix leaks, and keep food in sealed containers.
- Become an Mile-Free School. Launch an idling reduction campaign to reduce student exposure to taxic vehicle exhaust.
