IMPORTANT SAFETY PROTOCOL REMINDERS:



My goal for this school year is to bring calm and positivity to each group of students I interact with at Freeman, and I am working toward helping students achieve and develop a new form of success and ownership with their education. We are all being asked to develop new skills and experiment in unfamiliar territory, so I want to help all students recognize that they are not alone and that we are better when we all work together.



















Here is what we will be using as a guideline for COVID-19 exposure and symptoms and return to school/work protocols.



RETURN TO SCHOOL/CHILDCARE/WORK GUIDANCE FOLLOWING A POSITIVE SYMPTOM SCREEN FOR COVID-19 AND NO EXPOSURE

This guidance can be used by schools, childcare and parents when the COVID-19 rate in the community is MODERATE — HIGH (>25 cases/100,000 population over 14 days) and applies to persons with:

- One or more new, unexplained symptom consistent with COVID-19, AND
- No known COVID-19 exposure in prior 14 days

Does the person have:

- Any class A symptom of any duration, or
- Two or more class B symptoms of any duration, or
- One or more class B symptom(s) lasting > 24 hours

Person must isolate for 10 days after symptom onset unless:

- Person receives a negative PCR COVID test.
- Healthcare provider provides documentation of alternative diagnosis that explains all symptoms without performing a COVID test.

Does the person have:

One class B symptom lasting less than < 24 hours in duration

Person must remain isolated for at least 24 hours.
Evaluation and COVID test could be considered but is not necessary if symptoms resolve. If class B symptom resolves within 24 hours, person can return without healthcare provider evaluation or testing. If class B symptom lasts > 24 hours and/or more symptoms develop, follow algorithm to the left.

Symptoms consistent with COVID-19				
Class A Symptoms	Class B Symptoms			
 Fever (defined as subjective or 100.4°F or higher) Cough Loss of sense of taste and/or smell Shortness of breath 	 Fatigue Headache Muscle or body aches Sore throat Congestion or runny nose Nausea or vomiting Diarrhea (defined as two or more lose stools in 24 hours) 			

¹ Examples of alternative diagnosis made by healthcare provider include childhood rash illness, acute otitis media, or a lab confirmed diagnosis such as strep throat or non-COVID-19 viral pathogen. If testing for other viral pathogens, strongly recommend testing for COVID-19 as well.

- Meal kit pickup will be 12:15-12:45pm on Wednesday, Nov 25th due to early release
- Starting Nov 12th, all meal kits will be 3 day meal kits
- 3rd graders will be removed from the meal kit list when they go full-time
- High school students need to pick up their meal kits when they leave from school at the bus turnaround regardless of if they are driving or taking the bus, please make sure you let them know if they are signed up so they know to pick them up! 4th-8th graders will continue getting their meal kits on the bus, or picked up by parents.

MEAL COSTS:

- Meals are free through the end of the school year (applies to both meal kits and meals on campus)
- Second meals still cost the regular rate (\$2.95 at Elementary, \$3.15 at Middle School and \$3.30 at High School). If your child has seconds, their lunch account will be charged accordingly
- Milk also still costs \$0.60


