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Class of 2024: Yearbook Senior Pictures & Tributes

Deadline -October 13

Senior portraits and kid pictures are due Friday, October 13 for the 2024 Yearbook!

Submitting Senior Photos - both kid and senior portraits.

In order to receive the highest quality image, **we are requesting that you submit your photos on-line** this year (see directions below). Many studios will be able to do this for you. The senior portrait must be 2"x3" (vertical orientation) and at least 300 dpi. Scanned kid pictures should also be 300 dpi and approximately 2"x3". They can be any photo of your student starting from birth to whatever age you prefer/have access to a photo.

Deadline to submit both these photos to the yearbook is Friday, October 13.

Directions to upload your photos:

- A. Before uploading your photo, please save the image as a full size save and **RENAME** your senior portrait as follows to avoid misnaming: student's firstname_lastname (ex. Jenny_Smith) and your baby portrait to firstname_lastname_kid Jenny_Smith_kid) so that it is easy to identify photos.
- B. Next, go to www.hjeshare.com and enter the school code for Freeman

- (dawgcountry)
 C. You will be asked to put in your name, email and phone number.
 D. You will then be asked to "Agree to Terms", which is typical.
 E. You will then be asked to browse to your photo. Simply navigate to where you have the photo saved, select the photo, and click on upload.
- F. You are almost done it will then ask for some information about the picture, such as who is in it - please type in your child's name (we default to your student's given name in the yearbook. They may see me if they'd like to use a preferred name instead per state law). That's all there is to it!

Senior Tributes: If you are interested in purchasing a tribute, or "shout-out" for your child or grandchild, please see the reverse side of this flyer for information. You will be able to submit photo(s) and a message for your senior in the yearbook! What a great way to say something special that will last a lifetime! Hurry though space is limited! We sold out last year! To reserve your spot, simply contact Ms. Longinotti with the size you would like, or purchase your tribute through the Freeman Store by October 31 to reserve your spot and send in your info. Content for your tribute is due on Dec. 1. Payment is due by December 15th. We hope this message finds you well. As we continue to provide a safe and enriching environment for our students during after-school hours, we would like to bring to your attention an important matter regarding the supervision of your child(ren) during these Freeman events.

The safety and well-being of our students is our top priority. In order to maintain a secure and enjoyable experience for all, we kindly request your active involvement and supervision when your child(ren) attend after-school events. These events may include extracurricular activities, club meetings, sports practices, and various other programs outside of regular school hours.

To ensure the safety of all children, we ask parents to:

- Attend the event with your child(ren) if they are middle school age & younger.
- Report any unsafe behavior during the event.
- Be a positive role model.

And we ask students to:

- Remain on campus in the designated areas during the events that they are in attendance to support.
- Students should not be in school hallways during an indoor after-school event such as volleyball, basketball or wrestling.
- Students should not be on the baseball or softball fields during an outdoor afterschool event such as football.
- Students should not leave an after-school event that they are attending to go to the Freeman Store and then return to the event.

Your support to help keep all children safe is invaluable, and we are confident that with your help, we can make a positive change at after-school events for the safety and wellbeing of our students.

INFORMATION FOR PARENTS & STUDENTS

Our school will participate in the Healthy Youth Survey this Fall. Friday, October 20, 2023

The survey asks questions about risks for injury, health outcomes, and alcohol and drug use. Schools, and state and local agencies use survey results to support our youth and reduce their risks. The Healthy Youth Survey is voluntary and anonymous and provides important information to guide policy and programs that serve our youth.

> Please share this information with your student. Then talk about the survey and decide if your student will participate.

Q: Who will be asked to take the survey? A: Students in Grades 6 - 12.

Q: Is the survey voluntary?

A: Yes! Students taking the survey can skip questions and stop taking the survey at any time. If you do not want your student to participate in the survey, you can call the school to excuse your student. Students can also tell their teacher that they do not want to take the survey. Students not taking the survey will take part in a different activity, such as studying or reading in the library. There is no penalty for not taking part in the survey. Your student's grades will not be affected.

Q: What questions are on the survey? A: Survey questions come from surveys across the nation and in Washington. Parents or guardians can contact their school office to see a copy of the questionnaire or review the questions on www.askhys.net. Some topics include:

- Information, such as age, sex, race and ethnicity Feelings about school and community
- · Relationships with parents, friends, and neighbors
- Eating habits, physical activity
- Health education
- Attitudes about and the use of tobacco, alcohol and other drugs
- · Behaviors and feelings related to safety
- Behaviors related to violence
- Gender identity (optional and simplified version available for Grades 6 and 7*)
- Sexual orientation (not for Grades 6 and 7) •

Q: How is student identity protected? A: The HYS is always voluntary, and students will not put

their names on the survey. There are no codes or information to match a survey to a student. No one from the school will look at their answers. Students will submit their completed surveys confidentially when they are done.

If there were unauthorized access to students' answers, someone might try to identify a particular student using information like school, grade, and race/ethnicity. However, we take confidentiality very seriously and there are several steps we use to prevent unauthorized access to students' answers and to ensure that the sensitive information collected on the survey remains anonymous. Q: How are the survey results used? A:

Schools, school districts, counties and state agencies use the results to understand our students and to provide them with the services they need. Results are used for planning, evaluating, and improving programs, and getting the money to support them. Anonymous data are also shared with local health departments, Tribal Epidemiology Centers, and approved researchers.
