

FBLA REGIONAL CONFERENCE

On Monday, Freeman's FBLA chapter attended and competed at the 2024 NE Regional FBLA conference. There were approximately 400 students from 20 schools in attendance. There were approximately 70 different competitions taking place, from 100 question objective tests to individual and team performances. The top six students in each event qualified for state, which will be held in Spokane in late April. Freeman sent 36 students to compete at this conference. I am proud to say that 31 of our members finished in the top six and have now advanced to state. The other five students finished in the top ten and are alternates. Congratulations!











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
