DEMOGRAPHICS

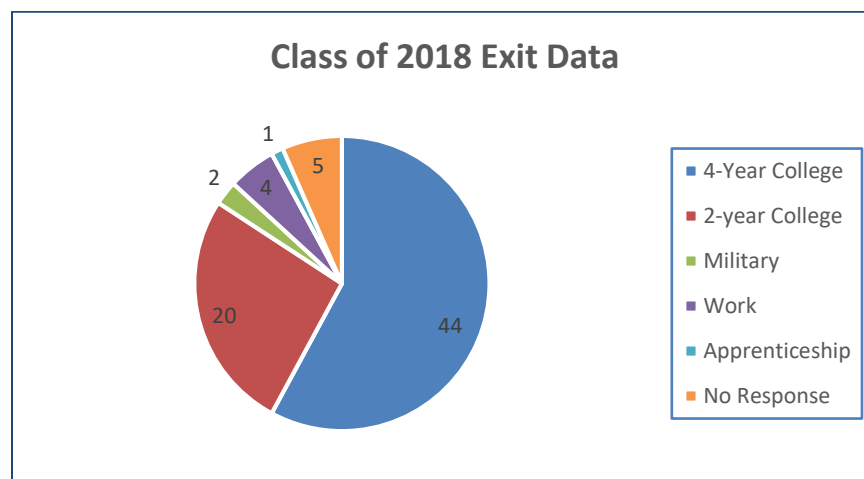
Freeman School District is a rural school located 15 miles south of Spokane Valley, Washington with an enrollment of 904 students K – 12; the high school has an enrollment of 336 in grades 9 – 12. The district race/ethnicity make up is largely white (88.7), with American Indian (06%), Hispanic (6.0), Asian /Pacific Islander (3.0 %), Black/African American (0.09%) and two or more races (0.9%) comprising the remainder

POST-SECONDARY PLANS

The **Class of 2018 cohort experienced a 100% graduation rate** of 76 seniors; 84% of seniors were headed to some type of post-secondary education experience, with 44 enrolling in a four-year college and 20 enrolling in a two-year college.



39 of the graduates will attend college in Washington. Students going out of state will attend Stanford University, US Military Academy at West Point, Arizona State University and Brigham Young University, University of Idaho, Boise State University, Grand Canyon University, Montana State University and the University of Hawaii.

GRADING AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Grade Point Average (GPA) and student ranking is calculated on an **unweighted** basis. GPAs are quoted on a 4.0 grading scale, with 1.0 being the passing mark. Freeman courses run year long with grading periods at the end of each semester. The grading scale used throughout the district is below:

The average cumulative g.p.a. for the **Class of 2018 was 3.359**. Freeman High School is on a six period per day schedule. Seniors in the Class of 2018 were required to earn **24 credits** to graduate. The breakdown of credit requirements is as follows:

- Freeman offers three years of Spanish; starting with the class of 2019, a foreign language will be a graduation requirement for the state of Washington.

COLLEGE ADMISSION TESTING

40 students of the **Class of 2018** (64%) took the SAT. Data for the Freeman High School **Class of 2018** mean scores for SAT are below as compared to state of Washington and national mean scores.

ACT no longer delineates scores by grade level; rather, all students whose scores are college reportable are included in the summary data provided by ACT. In the 2017 school year, 21 students took the ACT exam.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT COURSES & TESTING

Freeman High School offers a Pre-AP English courses to students in 10 grade, as well as six Advanced Placement courses: AP English Language, AP English Literature, AP Biology, AP Environmental Science, AP US Government & Politics, AP US History, AP Calculus AB. For the 2017-18 school year, 64 students sat for 74 AP exams. 61% of the exam scores were a score of 3 or higher.

Ten students earned *AP Scholar* designations, one earned *AP Scholar with Honor* recognition and one student earned the *AP Scholar with Distinction* designation. The Freeman Class of 2018 included one National Merit Scholar and one National Merit Commended Student.

Freeman participates in College in the High School and Running Start for the 2017-2018 school year, which reduced the number of students that sat for Advanced Placement testing.

DUAL ENROLLMENT:

During the 2017-2018 school year, juniors and seniors enrolled in **four College in the High School** courses. Students were able to earn college credit through Central Washington University and Eastern Washington University. College in the High School Courses included: English 101; Biology 100, Biology 201 and Environmental Studies 201. Freeman had 35 students enrolled in full or part time Running Start on the college campus. Additionally students had the opportunity to participate in Career and Technical Education credits at NEWTECH Skill Center and the Spokane Valley Technical Learning Center.
